Originally a _____between 1838-1869. In 1878, the City of London came into possession of the land and planned to use it as a park. You will notice several monuments like the Holy Roller that commemorates the First Hussars Regiment's role in the Normandy Campaign and the Cenotaph that is used annually on Remembrance Day.
